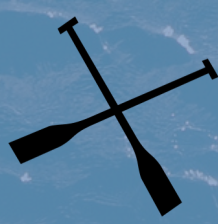

# FAQs



## WHEN IS THE PARK OPEN?

The park is open 7 days a week, with seasonal hours. Between October and March, the park is open 6 AM - 5 PM; between April and September, the park is open 6 AM - 7:30 PM.

## DO I HAVE TO PAY TO USE THE PARK?

The park is free for all visitors; however, visitors are required to purchase a \$5 city fishing license to fish in the lake.

## WHERE CAN I GET MY FISHING LICENSE?

License can be purchased at the Camp McClellan Horse Trials of America, located at 127 Mud Hole Rd, Anniston, AL 36205 (Open Monday - Sunday).

## IS A STATE FISHING LICENSE REQUIRED?

No, Lake Yahou is completely owned, maintained, and regulated by the City of Anniston, the city can issue its own fishing permit.

## DO MY KIDS / GRANDKIDS NEED FISHING LICENSES?

Anyone under the age of 16 only needs to be accompanied by someone with a city fishing license in order to fish at LYP.

## ARE TROLLING MOTORS ALLOWED IN THE LAKE?

No, no motorized water vehicles are allowed in the water.

# MULTI-USE TRAILS

McClellan's Multi-Use Trails include the first Phase I trails in Alabama built specifically for the National Interscholastic Cycling Association. There are a total of three phases of difficulty across 17 miles of forested trails, making them an exciting challenge for any age or experience level.

McClellan's Multi-Use Trails are open the same hours and seasons as Lake Yahou Park, and are suitable for biking, hiking, walking, or running. The trails can be accessed via BG DH Stem Ave or from Lake Yahou Park.
